2. Principal's Corner-Renault-Varian/Nelson

a. AVID

- i. Want to add program to Small
- ii. 3 sections (2 sections for 7th and 1 for 8th) of AVID will be applied for next year (.5 teacher units)-MULLEN
- iii. Aim for marginalized student to encourage them to attend college and take advanced courses that may not usually
 1. Students need outside encouragement to take steps and be better students leading to better habits in High School
 2. Students are being recruited and invited to program
 - a. Class will be a very rigorous and academic elective
 - b. There has to be campus buy-in to apply AVID program
 - i. PD this summer for 1 teacher from each core to teach more people about techniques to learn best practices

b. CIP Part 2

- i. Disproportionality in discipline

1. 41 students (3.4% of our population) suspended to home since August (twice as high as last year)

- a. 118 (9.8%) incidents that sent students to Behavioral Modification Center (BMC)

2. Numbers need to improve but discipline should still be enforced based on infraction

3. Numbers are also different because there are new administrative guidelines and there is an attempt to improve the culture of the school
